We thank you both for all your hard work and commitment to Omagh Academy and wish you well for the future.



#### HISTORY CONFERENCE

The event supported the pupils in preparation for their A2 History Module on the Partition of Ireland 1900-1925.

#### HOLOCAUST VISIT

GCSE History pupils recently had the opportunity to attend a Holocaust event held at The Silverbirch hotel. Pupils listened to the story of Sam Gardner, delivered by his daughter, Maralyn. The presentation was informative, insightful, emotive, and extremely educational.





Sam Gardner was born in 1925 as Shmuel Yankel Golberg, in Pietrokow, Poland. Following the German invasion of Poland in 1939, punitive laws were enforced against the Jews, who were constantly in fear for their lives. In 1942 Sam and his father were selected to work as slave labourers in an ammunitions factory. A year later they were moved to Buchenwald Concentration Camp where they lost their only possessions – their treasured photographs. In 1944 he was separated from his father in Schlieben Labour Camp, never to see him again. Finally, in April 1945 Sam was taken on a long 'death journey' on cramped cattle trucks with no food, water or sanitation, to Mauthausen Concentration Camp. Out of 2000 on the journey he was one of 42 that survived. The survivors of Mauthausen were liberated by the Americans, whom Sam described as 'Angels from Heaven'.

When Britain agreed to take 1000 child refugees, Sam was one of the 300 'Boys' who were taken to Windermere. He finally settled in Manchester, married and had two daughters, four grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Sam's story of survival is told by his daughter Maralyn.

Holocaust Memorial Day was remembered on Monday 27th January. Year 11 History students visited the Market Place Theatre in Armagh to watch a screening of "One Life" - The Story of Nicholas Winton and the Kindertransport trains. This was a very poignant and thought-provoking trip.

#### AS POLITICS VISIT

Year 13 Politics Students visited Parliament Buildings, Stormont on Tuesday 25th February as part of their AS Politics course. Pupils had the opportunity to watch a plenary session in the chamber, question MLAs on their



SKI TRIP 2025





Our Year 13 Geographers recently visited the Umbra Sand Dunes near Magilligan, a dynamic coastal ecosystem, to prepare for their Unit 3 examination.

They studied primary succession in this psammosere, observing biotic factors such as plant diversity and species. They also analysed abiotic factors, including wind speed, air temperature, light levels, and soil characteristics, collecting samples to meet the aims of their study. The dry weather made investigations smooth and everyone had a great day. Well done, Year 13!
